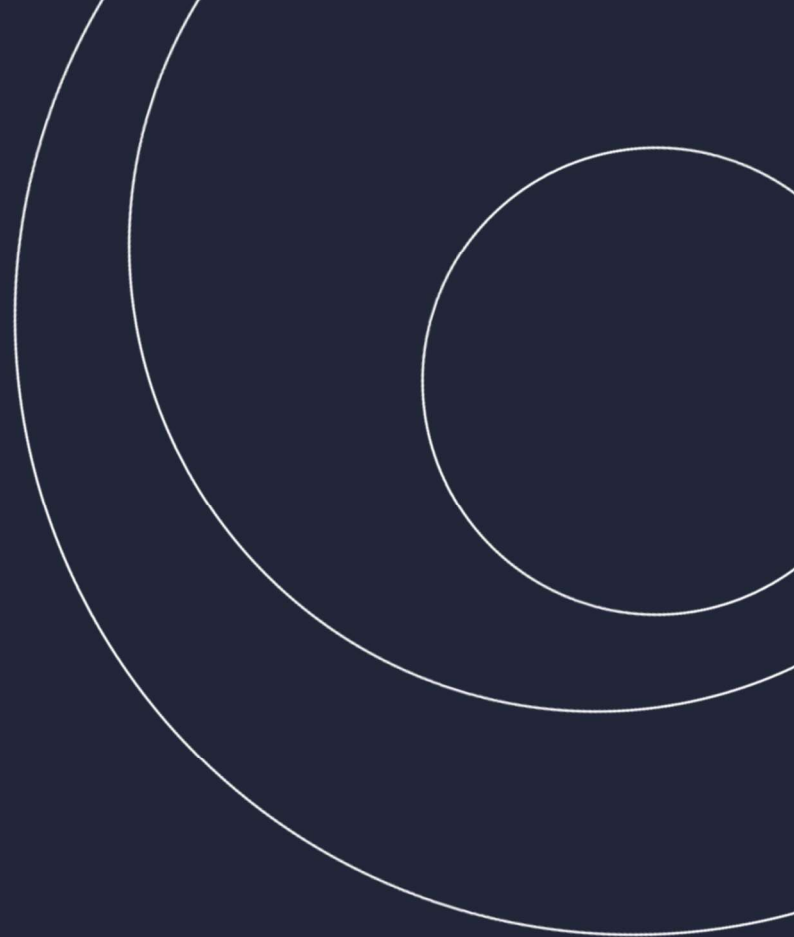

Refund for re-export

Dansk Producentansvar, December 2021

DPA is short for Dansk Producentansvar (Danish Producer Responsibility). DPA oversees administrative tasks associated with the rules on producer responsibility under the Danish environmental law regarding waste from electrical and electronic equipment, end-of-life batteries and accumulators, and end-of-life vehicles.

The producer responsibility for these waste types has authority in the Danish Environmental Protection Act. This Act translates into three Statutory Orders for the different waste types: the WEEE Order, the Battery Order, and the End-of-life Vehicles Order (the current statutory texts can be found on www.producentansvar.dk).

The Danish Statutory Orders take offset in three EU directives for the same waste types: the so-called WEEE Directive, the Batteries Directive, and the ELV Directive. Also, these directives with exact titles and dates can be found on www.producentansvar.dk.

Producer responsibility rests on the principle that each producer or importer assumes responsibility for collection and management of WEEE, waste batteries, and end-of-life vehicles to the effect that products becoming waste are managed in an environmentally correct manner, with the highest possible utilisation of resources contained in such products.

Producers and importers are in the following referred to as *producers* as the rules applying to both types are the same.

In general, the following abbreviations are used: WEEE for waste electrical and electronic equipment, BAT for batteries and accumulators, and ELV for end-of-life vehicles.

Refund for re-export

According to the WEEE Order, a producer can get a refund for re-export of a quantity (in kilograms) of electrical equipment placed on the market in Denmark exported by a subsequent dealer.

Re-export means that equipment sold by a producer on the Danish market and reported to the producer register is exported out of Denmark by a subsequent level in the supply chain.

Refund means a set-off in the producer's allocation, financial guarantee and fee to DPA further to the export out of Denmark for the part of the registered quantity placed on the market.

If the reported re-export triggers a compensation from the producer's collective scheme, this is a commercial affair between the two parties in which DPA is not a part. DPA is only concerned with the statutory administration fees established once a year.

Reporting of a re-exported quantity

In connection with the annual reporting, the producer can report quantities re-exported in the reporting year. Reporting is broken down on categories and end-user types.

If the producer wishes to report a re-exported quantity for a period prior to the reporting period, he must follow the rules applying to corrections. Corrections require a correction declaration which you fill out when you are logged into the Register. Note that corrections can only be made two calendar years back.

Documentation for a re-exported quantity

When a report is made of re-exported quantities, it must be documented with a declaration. The registered producer must submit/upload this declaration to DPA. The company re-exporting the quantity in question must document with a signature:

- The magnitude of the re-exported quantity stated in kilograms and broken down on categories and end-users
- The year the re-export took place, max 2 years back
- That the quantity in question originates from the producer in question

The producer can only report a re-exported quantity if he has a declaration documenting the re-exported quantity and if he submits this declaration to the producer register before the end of the reporting period on 31 March.

The producer must fill in the declaration in the format found on DPA's website and have it signed by the re-exporting company. Then the producer attaches the declaration in a pdf-format to the annual reporting.
